BHDTA Affiliated Clubs' Midland Region Rep's report November 2009

The Affiliated Club Liaison Committee has only met twice during 2009, but all members have kept in touch via email and by meeting at National events throughout the season.

As I reported last year, one of our Committee, Audrey Barron, was co-opted to Council, and at our meeting prior to the October 2009 AGM, Mike Watts who represents clubs in the East was elected as our second representative on Council. This now means that we – YOU - have a direct line through me to the BHDTA Council. If you have anything to say, criticisms, or better still helpful suggestions, we are here to listen.

All Affiliated Club members should now have a pink membership card denoting that they are an Affiliated Member of the BHDTA. You will see that it says that you are now insured for up to £30m when attending or competing at events run by WDDC. If you want or need to extend this cover, you can contact the BHDTA to upgrade your membership. For instance, by becoming an Associate Member of BHDTA, costing £54/year, you will get this £30m of legal liability cover for 365 days/year. Cheap as chips I say!

The Club Liaison Committee is exploring the possibility of creating a model set of rules for driving trials, in the hope that they might become adopted in time by the Clubs, so that club competitors entering at 'other clubs' will not have to learn another set of rules.

The Club Pack, so well received by all club secretaries has been updated once in the past year, and is available for you all to view on line on the BHDTA website, under the heading of Affiliated Clubs – click on to Club Paperwork. Take a look – you'll be surprised at what goes on behind the scenes to put on an event!

It was the object of BHDTA Council that the regional reps would administer any grant funding that became available for a Regional Training Scheme. This has not yet come to fruition. The BHDTA made a grant application for training funding to Sport England via the British Equestrian Federation. The actual bid was largely ignored but they were granted funds specifically for UKcc Coach Training and assessment, developing greater involvement of disabled drivers and training for potential World Class competitors. The Regional Training Scheme was not considered. This was very disappointing, but as the Sport England funding runs until 2013, we have not yet lost hope and there is a meeting with the BEF tomorrow at which the emphasis of the 2010 bid will be discussed. To this end, I was asked to become the BHDTA's representative at the BEF Participation Steering Group to make sure that we remain represented.
